## **Alternative Wine Country Excursions**


We've tried to approximate the Napa Valley "wine experience" in the two following excursions. What we mean by that is, we've selected wineries in each area that have "something extra," such as a vineyard tour, picnic area, gardens, distinctive architecture, interesting history, etc. Instead of simply hopping from one wine tasting to another, you'll have the opportunity and time to enjoy the eclectic aura of California's wine country.

We had the assistance of knowledgeable locals in selecting these wineries, and we've confirmed their excellence during personal visits.

If you are a novice or occasional wine drinker you may find the "Brief Wine Primer" earlier in this chapter to be of value before you begin touring and tasting.

Generally, there is a wine tasting fee in Sonoma Valley wineries, which is often waived with a purchase. In contrast, wine tasting is often complimentary in the Alexander/Dry Creek/Russian River Valley area.

Please remember that wine tastings can lead to slowed reflexes; so eat something between tastings, be especially cautious as you drive, or appoint a designated driver.



#### SONOMA VALLEY EXCURSION

So that you have some choice, we provide information here on eight selected wineries in the Sonoma Valley. While it's possible to visit all eight in one day, we recommend that you limit yourself to only five; otherwise, you may find yourself rushing and not enjoying. So, our suggestion is: read through all the descriptions and settle on the ones that most appeal to you. They are arranged in sequence from south to north, so that no matter which ones you choose, your progression from one winery to the next should be fairly smooth. In our opinion, the Benziger vineyard tram tour and Chateau St. Jean's architecture and gardens should not be missed.

We also recommend that you buy sandwiches at the Glen Ellen Village Market and eat lunch at one of three picnic areas. And we suggest the Jack London State Historic Park as a nice change of pace.

## **Buena Vista Historic Winery**

This is where European-style wine making began in California. Read the outside display boards, opposite the tasting room, to learn about grape growing in this cooler Carneros microclimate, and how Hungarian Agoston Haraszthy was the first (in 1857) to replace the pedestrian mission grape with grapes from France and Germany. Try the Pinot Noir, Merlot and Chardonnay. Open weekdays 10am to 5pm, Saturday and Sunday 10am-5:30pm; 18000 Old Winery Rd., Sonoma 95476; 707-265-1472; www. buenavistawinery.com.

# **Robledo Family Winery**

This is the first winery established in America (1997) by a Mexican migrant vineyard worker. All nine Robledo children are involved in the operation. Their story is told in the August 2005 *People* magazine. The winery is in the Carneros Region, which is influenced by Pacific Ocean and San Francisco Bay weather. Try the Pinot Noir, Syrah and Sauvignon Blanc. Open Monday through Saturday 10am to 5pm and Sunday 11am to 4pm; 21901 Bonness Rd., Sonoma 95476; 707-939-6903, *www.robledofamily winery.com*.

## Larson Family Winery/Sonoma Creek

Also family-owned (since the 1860s) and located in the Carneros Region, this winery was the site of the Sonoma Rodeo from 1920 to the early 1950's, and exhibits plenty of rodeo memorabilia to prove it. Steamboats once called here from Oakland. See Dollie Llama and Lucky Lamb, play bocci ball. Try the Gewurztraminer. ### Lunchtime in the Glen Ellen Area

Buy your deli lunch at the Glen Ellen Village Market, 13751 Arnold Drive. This market features the best delicatessen that we've ever seen, and the ready-made sandwiches are super-delicious. Picnic at: Benziger (shaded, with the most seating), B.R. Cohn (a wonderful patio), or Imagery (sunny tables in both front and back of the winery).

#### B.R. Cohn

Here, you'll find not only vineyards, but also a 130-year old olive grove. Not surprisingly, they sell wines, olive oils and vinegars. The winery's owner was the Dooby Brothers road manager. There are also a stage for large benefit concerts and a patio area for picnics. They specialize in Cabernet Sauvignon. ## **Imagery Estate Winery**

Owned by Benziger, Imagery commissions artists to create new labels each year and displays 170 original pieces of label art displayed around the tasting room and in the gallery, thus claiming the world's largest wine label art collection. Outside, on the "Appellation Trail," be sure to read the descriptions of a dozen varietals in the showcases. Although wines are distributed only to California restaurants and wine shops, they can be purchased in the tasting room and online. Try the Malbec and White Burgundy.
